<p>Prior to the updated VFD regulations, very few states participated in a VFD inspection. Now that the regulations are effective and future contract work has to be considered, further information would be needed to assess what these types of inspections entail. This presentation will provide an instructional approach to performing VFD inspections in lieu of future inspection work to be performed by state feed inspection staff.</p>
