Dr. Grandin is a designer of livestock handling facilities and an objective scoring system for auditing the handling of livestock at meat plants, and a Professor of Animal Science at Colorado State University. She obtained her B.A. at Franklin Pierce College and her M.S. in Animal Science at Arizona State University. Dr. Grandin received her Ph.D in Animal Science from the University of Illinois in 1989. Today she teaches courses on livestock behavior and facility design at Colorado State University and consults with the livestock industry on facility design, livestock handling, and animal welfare. She has appeared on a variety of television shows in the U.S. and other countries, and has authored over 400 articles in both scientific journals and livestock periodicals on animal handling, welfare, and facility design. In 2010, Time Magazine named her one of the 100 most influential people. In 2017, she was inducted into The Women's Hall of Fame and in 2018 made a fellow by the American Association for the Advancement of Science.
